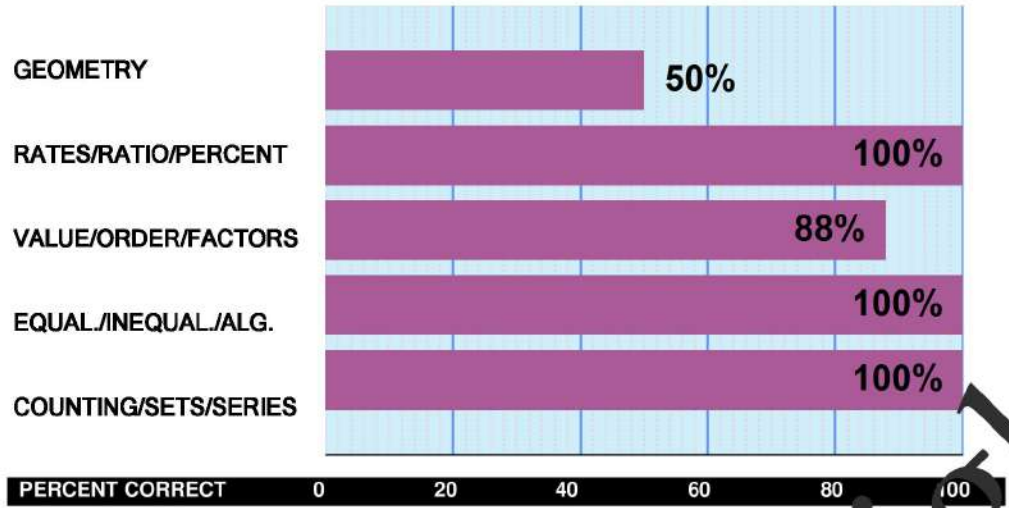

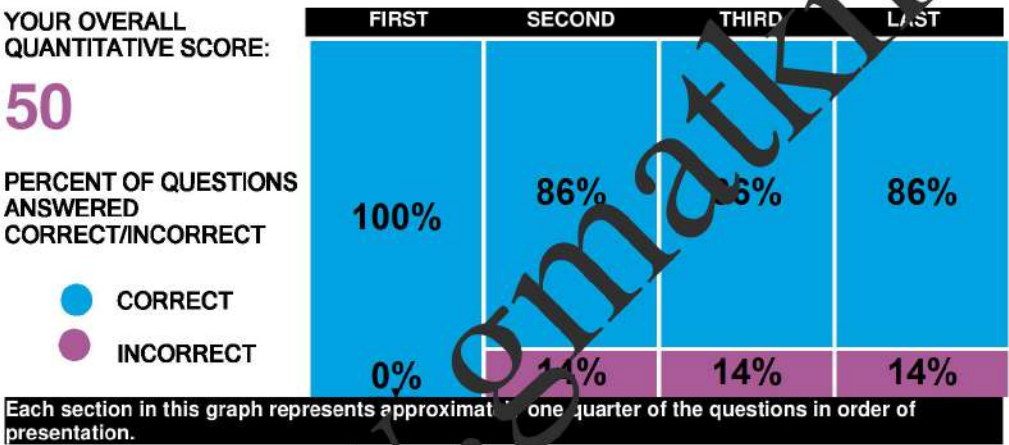

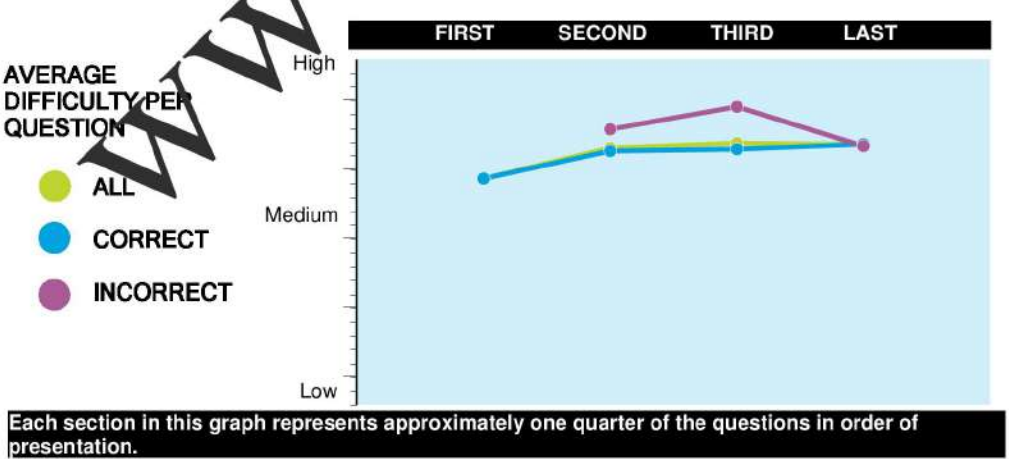
## PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS

## AVERAGE DIFFICULTY

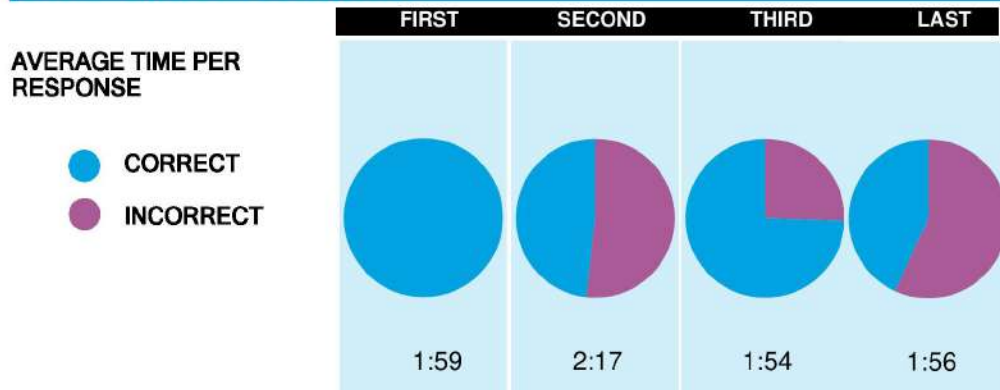
